MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



It is an honor to serve as President of the International Association for Dental, Oral, and Craniofacial Research. As the leading voice in our field, IADR continues to advance research, broaden knowledge, and improve oral health and well-being worldwide by representing the dental, oral, and craniofacial (DOC) research community and facilitating the exchange and application of research findings year after year. The expansion of the official IADR name is evidence of our future scope and ambitions!

As IADR continues to serve the needs of the international community, we amplified our global reach in 2023 with our second General Session & Exhibition held in the Latin American Region. The event drew more than 1,500 delegates from 76 countries and offered attendees a large variety of Interactive Talk presentations, Focused Learning Sessions, Hands-on Workshops, Symposia, and Satellite Symposia. As an added benefit, the General Session was held in conjunction with the 12th World Congress on Preventive Dentistry, which included specialized plenary sessions and Interactive Talks offering an in-depth look at global oral health policy initiatives.

Our members can take advantage of exclusive, year-round educational content in the IADR Webinar and CE On-Demand Library, which includes “Robotics & Artificial Intelligence: Targeting Oral Health Care in Africa in the Digital Age” as well as a highly popular webinar on Abstract Submission Best Practices.

Our society publications maintain their strength and reputation among the top journals in the discipline. The *Journal of Dental Research* Journal Impact Factor places it at #3 of 91 journals in the “Dentistry, Oral Surgery & Medicine” category, with an Immediacy Index of 1.1

and an article Influence score of 1.638. The *JDR* once again ranked #1 of 91 journals in total citations, with a total of 25,849 in 2022, and ranked #3 in Eigenfactor with a score of 0.01345. Its sister publication, *JDR Clinical & Translational Research*, reached a major milestone in 2023 with its own Impact Factor, building on the momentum of its first appearance in the ESCI and the publication of its first supplement last year.

IADR members answered a call to action with IADR’s first full year of its fundraising campaign in 2023. This support is crucial to our ability to fund initiatives such as travel support for new investigators from low- and middle-income countries to present their research at the IADR General Session and outreach to countries without capacity by fostering new investigator research through fellowships and membership funding.

Since 1996, the IADR Regional Development Program has distributed more than \$1.3 million in funding to enhance research capacity and research infrastructure. In 2023, it allocated more than \$46,000 in funding for special projects in Chile and Egypt.

As you read this Annual Report, you will also learn about some of the developments that you can expect in 2024 and beyond. I hope that all IADR members will remain active in the association as we continue to improve, expand, and enhance the membership experience and strengthen the scientific community worldwide.

MESSAGE FROM THE IADR CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER



For over a century, IADR has served as the premier international association driving dental, oral, and craniofacial (DOC) research for health and well-being worldwide. Thanks to the leadership of then President Brian O'Connell in the first half of 2023 and President Ophir Klein in the second half, a dedicated Board of Directors, and an exceptional staff, IADR has continued its long tradition of excellence for another year and looks forward to even greater achievements on the horizon.

IADR held to the 101st General Session & Exhibition with the IADR Latin American Region in Bogotá, Colombia. The event provided DOC health scientists with the opportunity to showcase their achievements, share their latest discoveries, and forge new connections with their international peers at the first 100% in-person IADR General Session since 2019. As part of the Opening Ceremonies, IADR President Brian O'Connell announced the official expansion of the IADR name to the **International Association for Dental, Oral, and Craniofacial Research** to better encompass IADR's members' breadth of science. This change presents IADR as an inclusive community for all scientists committed to furthering DOC research as a means to improve overall health and well-being.

The 2023 IADR/LAR General Session & Exhibition was joined by the 12th World Congress on Preventive Dentistry, which offered a unique scientific program that communicated the latest research findings that can have a positive impact on global oral health, while raising awareness of oral diseases globally and encouraging policymakers to incorporate oral health into public health intervention programs.

I'm happy to report that the *Journal of Dental Research (JDR)* led the category of Dentistry, Oral Surgery, & Medicine in total citations and continues to publish top-quality DOC research month after month. The *JDR* currently has a 2-Year Journal Impact Factor™ (JIF) of 7.6 according to the rankings released by Clarivate™ earlier this year. In July, *JDR* announced the publication of a Special Issue entitled, "Aging and Oral Health," which covered numerous topics

related to new advances in the biological mechanisms underpinning aging and the role of oral health in age-related conditions such as cognitive decline. It also explored novel ideas for improving oral health care in the population as a means for promoting general health in older people.

A new issue of *Advances in Dental Research* offered a comprehensive analysis of aging and oral health research, summarizing the three-day "Meeting Within a Meeting" on the topic of "Geroscience: Aging and Oral Health Research," organized by AADOCR past president Jane Weintraub at the 2023 AADOCR/CADR Annual Meeting in Portland, OR, USA. Additionally, we look forward to the publication of another *JDR* special issue in 2024 highlighting innovations and applications of advanced imaging techniques for the benefit of DOC health. This issue will be of great interest to all oral health researchers and practitioners.

In June, IADR announced that the *JDR Clinical & Translational Research (JDR CTR)* had received its first ever Journal Impact Factor. *JDR CTR* earned a JIF of 3.0, with an Eigenfactor™ of 0.00148, an Immediacy Index of 0.5, and 786 total citations in 2022. This represents a significant achievement and a huge milestone in *JDR CTR's* history, which was launched in 2016.

Relying on the dedication, expertise, and passion of our members, IADR was able to boast many accomplishments this year. They continue to help us work toward advancing our mission of driving DOC research and increasing knowledge for the improvement of oral health and well-being worldwide.

2023 HIGHLIGHTS

JDR Clinical & Translational Research Receives First Ever Impact Factor™

The International Association for Dental, Oral, and Craniofacial Research (IADR) and the American Association for Dental, Oral, and Craniofacial Research (AADOCR) announced the *JDR Clinical & Translational Research (JDR CTR)* has received its first Journal Impact Factor™.

JDR CTR has earned a Journal Impact Factor of 3.0, with an Eigenfactor™ of 0.00148, an Immediacy Index of 0.5, and 786 total citations in 2022. This represents a significant achievement and a huge milestone in *JDR CTR*'s history, which was launched in 2016.

Journal of Dental Research Announces New Impact Factor™

IADR and AADOCR announced the *Journal of Dental Research 2-Year Journal Impact Factor™* is now 7.6, ranking it #3 of 91 journals in the "Dentistry, Oral Surgery & Medicine" category.

The *JDR 5-year Journal Impact Factor™* is also 7.6, with an Immediacy Index of 1.1 and an article Influence score of 1.638. The *JDR* once again ranked #1 of 91 journals in total citations, with a total of 25,849 in 2022, and ranked #3 in Eigenfactor with a score of 0.01345.

Journal of Dental Research Publishes Special Issue on Aging and Oral Health

The IADR and AADOCR have announced the publication of a Special Issue of the *Journal of Dental Research* entitled, "Aging and Oral Health." The issue features Bei Wu, New York University, USA and Ana Paula Vieira Colombo, Federal University of Rio de Janeiro, Brazil as Guest Editors.

The *JDR* special issue, "Aging and Oral Health" covers numerous topics related to new advances in the biological mechanisms underpinning aging and the role of oral health in age-related conditions such as cognitive decline. It also explores novel ideas for improving oral health care in the population as a means for promoting general health in older people.

World Congress on Preventive Dentistry

The 2023 IADR/LAR General Session & Exhibition was joined by the 12th World Congress on Preventive Dentistry (WCPD). This special event took place on the final two days of the meeting and offered a unique scientific program that communicated the latest research findings that can have a positive impact on global oral health.

The WCPD aimed to raise awareness of oral diseases globally, their social and commercial determinants, promote healthy environments, highlight the impact of oral diseases on poor and disadvantaged populations, and encourage policy makers to incorporate oral health into public health intervention programs as part of primary health care and universal health coverage.

JDR Clinical & Translational Research Welcomes New Associate Editor



The IADR and AADOCR have announced that *JDR Clinical & Translational Research* has selected Vanessa Muirhead as Associate Editor.

Muirhead, BSc (hons), BDS, MSc, PhD, FHEA, FDS (RCS) DPH, is a Clinical Reader in Dental Public Health at Queen Mary of University of London, UK. Her BSc honors degree in Experimental Pathology was

followed by her bachelor's degree in dental surgery (BDS). She then completed a PhD in Epidemiology, as well as two Post-Doctoral Fellowships in qualitative and mixed methods research.

IADR Has an Expanded Name

As part of the 2023 IADR/LAR General Session & Exhibition with WCPD Opening Ceremonies, IADR President Brian O'Connell announced the official expansion of the IADR name to the International Association for Dental, Oral, and Craniofacial Research and unveiled the new IADR logo:



This change presents IADR as an inclusive community for all scientists committed to driving dental, oral, and craniofacial research for health and well-being worldwide. The three shades of blue represent dental, oral, and craniofacial research – the domains upon which our organization is based – and the simplified design achieves a more modern feel as IADR moves into its next century.

INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATIONS

Accelerating the Phase Down of Dental Amalgam: Progress Continues

On Thursday, October 12, the IADR, FDI, ADA, and IDM hosted a webinar entitled, "Accelerating the Phase Down of Dental Amalgam: Progress Continues." The webinar dove into the critical need for the implementation of a phase-down approach that is protective of human and environmental health across all geographies. Presenters described progress in phasing down dental amalgam, outlined the importance and efficiency of amalgam separators, provided an update on research advancements into mercury-free alternatives, and discussed the potential impact of the GEF7 project.

Presented at the 76th WHO World Health Assembly

The 76th World Health Assembly (WHA76) was held in Geneva, Switzerland, on May 21–30, 2023. IADR, in collaboration with other non-communicable disease (NCD) related and public health stakeholders, intervened during four agenda items with three statements.

1. In collaboration with the FDI, IADR urged governments to integrate oral health and oral health research into national NCDs and UHC agendas, ensure access to a basic package of essential oral health services at the primary care level, include dental care coverage in health insurance packages, and include oral health in national health surveillance by fully implementing the Global Oral Health Action Plan.
2. IADR supported a Constituency Statement to urge governments to increase domestic mobilization and allocation of resources, ensure access to essential health services across the continuum of care in emergencies, particularly for those at high risk and in vulnerable situations, and strengthen the NCD component of pandemic prevention, preparedness, and response efforts.

3. IADR supported a Constituency Statement to urge governments to recognize the importance of involving people living with NCDs (including with eye and oral diseases) and all health professionals in the planning and development of well-being policies such as health promotion, measure and leverage the co-benefits of health promotion efforts for other sectors to promote multisectoral solutions, and consider this framework in broader UN processes as there are currently no SDG indicators measuring well-being.

IADR Intervenes at UN Multi-Stakeholder Hearing on Universal Health Coverage

The President of the United Nations General Assembly convened a series of multi-stakeholder hearings in preparation for the General Assembly High-level Meetings on the Fight against Tuberculosis, Pandemic Prevention, Preparedness, and Response and Universal Health Coverage (UHC) - General Assembly, 77th session.

On May 9, 2023, IADR participated in the UHC hearing as well as a series of relevant side-meetings with stakeholders including the NCD Alliance, UHC2030, and the Health Caribbean Coalition. The hearing was divided into an opening segment, two panels – UHC as a Driver to Accelerate Health for All and From UHC Commitment to Actions and Accountability – and a closing segment. IADR was granted the opportunity to provide a verbal intervention (on behalf of both IADR and the FDI World Dental Federation) that emphasized that health systems can only be strengthened for UHC by including oral health care services and financing mechanisms that reimburse oral disease prevention and treatment.

IADR Partners with WHO and UNEP on Dental Amalgam Project

The IADR and FDI World Dental Federation are partners in the project, *Accelerate implementation of dental amalgam provisions and strengthen country capacities in the environmental sound management of associated wastes under the Minamata Convention*. The project was launched on April 28, 2023, and will be led by the UN Environment Program (UNEP), with funding from the Global Environmental Facility and executed by the WHO. The project aims to phase down the use of dental amalgam in three countries; Senegal, Thailand, and Uruguay, and improve the management of mercury-containing waste.

Fifth Conference of the Parties on the Minamata Convention: IADR Intervenes

During the fifth Conference of the Parties on the Minamata Convention (COP5), Parties considered three proposals to amend Annex A: Part I and II. Botswana and Burkina Faso submitted an amendment proposing alternate text on behalf of the African Region (AR) that called for the phase out of dental amalgam by 2030. IADR, in collaboration with the FDI, intervened with a statement that provided support for the current phase down approach of the Minamata Convention without the need for further amendments to Annex A. Further, as outlined in the Global Oral Health Action Plan, IADR urged all Parties to maintain the current phase-down model which respects differences in country capacities and guarantees access to oral health and the overall well-being of populations.

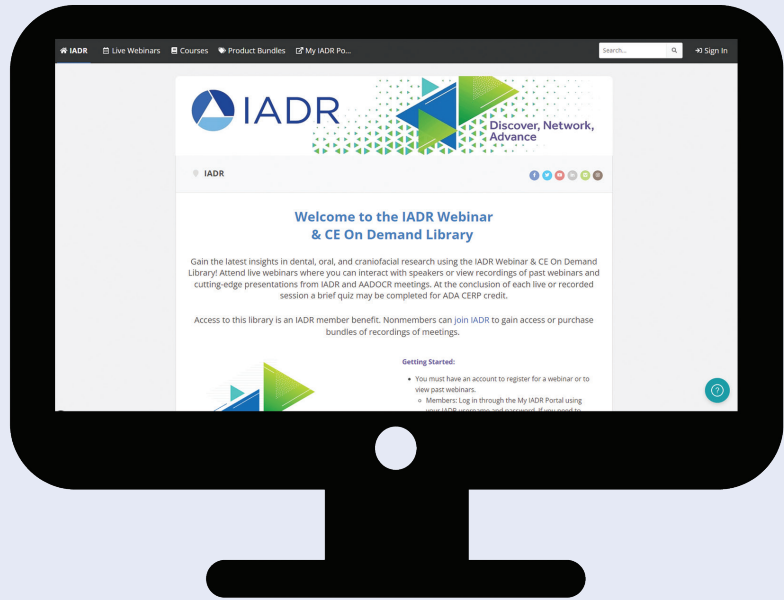

Robotics & Artificial Intelligence: Targeting Oral Health Care in Africa in the Digital Age

Best Practices for IADR Abstract Proposal Preparation & Submission

Sponsored by the IADR Behavioral, Epidemiologic and Health Services Research Group (BEHSR)
September 14, 2023

This webinar provided an overview of the IADR abstract and session proposal process in view of the 2024 IADR General Session in New Orleans, USA. Presenters highlighted resources made available by the IADR for preparing and submitting abstracts and session proposals including important dates and deadlines. Emphasis was placed on preparing complete and guideline-adhering submissions. Criteria for abstract and proposal selection was elaborated. Presenters discussed elements of well-structured and informative abstracts and best practices for communicating scientific information via an IADR abstract. The session concluded with a discussion and Q&A session between BEHSR members and webinar participants.

IADR Centennial Travel Award for New Investigators

This travel grant is designed to encourage new investigators to undertake research and to support their attendance for presentation of research in any of the IADR Scientific Group & Network research areas.

IADR David B. Scott Fellowship

The David B. Scott Fellowship is awarded annually to a dental student in one IADR Division and will rotate alphabetically among the Divisions. It will be the

Division's responsibility to select the recipient by any method it devises, but the Division must present the candidate's name and the proposal for his or her research experience to the IADR Board of Directors for approval.

IADR John Clarkson Fellowship

The purpose of the IADR John Clarkson Fellowship is to allow investigators to obtain training and experience in dental public health at a center of excellence. The Fellow will receive funding for accommodation, subsistence, and travel.

IADR John A. Gray Fellowship

Awarded every two years, the purpose of this fellowship is to allow a dental or postgraduate student to obtain training and experience in dental or related research. This Fellowship is in tribute to John A. Gray, former Executive Director of IADR, and is funded out of donations from members and sponsors.

IADR Isaac Schour Memorial Award

The IADR Isaac Schour Memorial Award honors Dr. Isaac Schour, an early leader in international dental research and the 18th President of the IADR (1941-42). Dr. Schour was Professor of Histology (1935-64) and Dean (1955-64) of the University of Illinois, College of Dentistry. The award is currently funded through a generous endowment provided by Dr. Bernard G. Sarnat, a former graduate student of Schour, and Rhoda G. Sarnat through the Sarnat Family Foundation. Additional funding is accepted by individuals. The award recognizes outstanding scientific contributions in the anatomic sciences, including tissue engineering, tissue regeneration, and stem cell research as it relates to the oral, dental, or craniofacial complex.

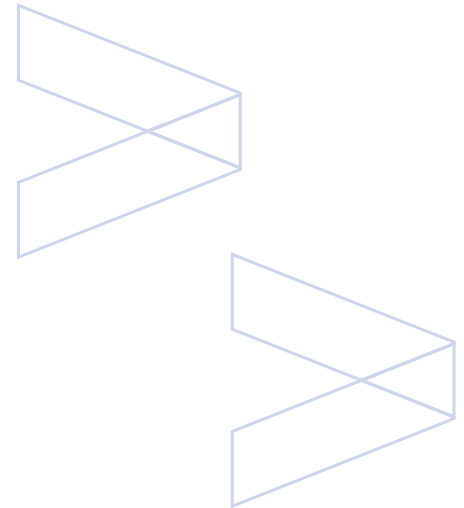
IADR Scientific Groups and Networks Support

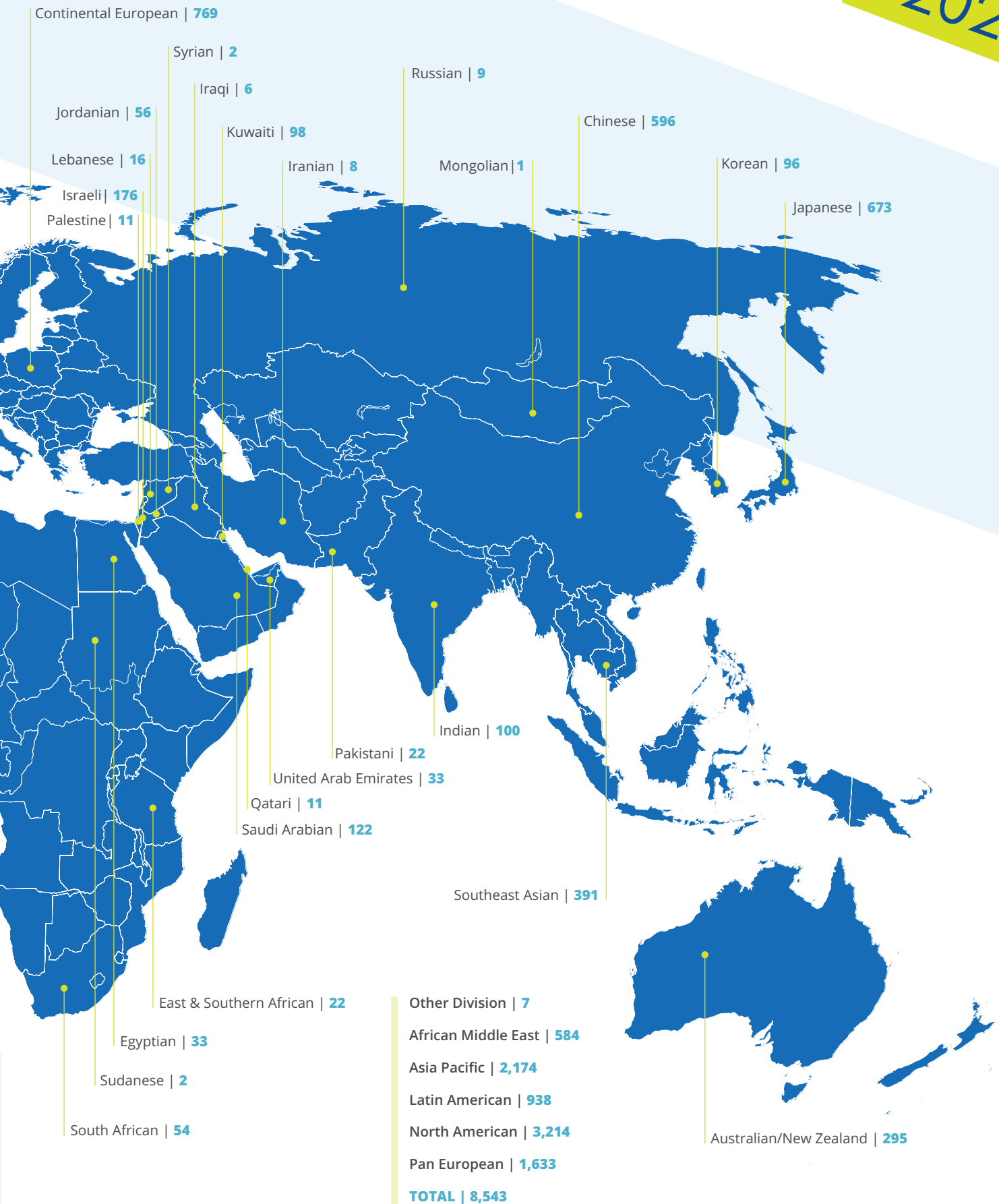
The RDP Committee continues to assist Divisions and Sections with their applications towards programs that align with the RDP intent.
