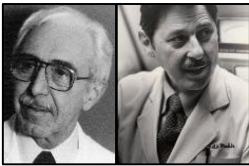

# 2023 RECIPIENT OF THE WILMER SOUDER AWARD

The International Association for Dental Research (IADR) announced that **Jason Griggs** is this year's recipient of the IADR Distinguished Scientist Wilmer Souder Award. Griggs, from the University of Mississippi, Jackson, USA, was recognized during the Opening Ceremonies of the 101<sup>st</sup> General Session of the IADR, which was held in conjunction with the 9<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Latin American Region and the 12<sup>th</sup> World Congress on Preventive Dentistry, that took place on June 21, 2023, in Bogotá, Colombia.



Griggs is currently the Vice-Chair, Division of Physics & Engineering, Mississippi Academy of Sciences, USA. Since 2008, he has served as Adjunct Professor at the Department of Civil Engineering, University of Mississippi, Oxford, USA, and as Associate Dean for Research, School of Dentistry, University of Mississippi Medical Center, Jackson, USA.

He completed his undergraduate and postgraduate studies at the University of Florida, Gainesville, USA in the field of materials science. He then moved to Baylor College of Dentistry in Dallas, Texas, USA as an Assistant Professor. In 2007, he was promoted to full Professor and became Chairman at the Department of Biomedical Materials Science at the University of Mississippi Medical Center. He has supervised many MS and PhD students and written numerous book chapters.

Through his NIH-funded R01 grants, Griggs's scientific work contributed to improving the strength of dental porcelain, developing test methods for ceramic fracture toughness measurements, and rapid testing methods for dental implants. He has presented several papers at the IADR and other scientific meetings and has published more than 90 peer-reviewed publications on this topic. He served as Vice-President and President for the IADR Dallas Section and chaired the AADOCR Science Information Committee. He has also served on the editorial boards for the Journal of Dental Research and Dental Materials.

The IADR Wilmer Souder Award recognizes excellence in the field of dental materials research among those scientists who, through research in this field, bring about outstanding advances in dental health.



# IADR COUNCILOR'S REPORT

Dear DMG member,

Please, find below a summary of the IADR Council meeting held on June 20<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

## Election results

Council approved the following slate of nominees to stand for the IADR Vice-president 2024-2025 election: *Jennifer Gallagher* (PER), British Division, Global Oral Health Inequalities Research Network, *Mark Herzberg* (NAR), AADOCR, Microbiology/Immunology Group, and *Marco Peres* (APR), Southeast Asian Division, Behavioral Epidemiologic and Health Services Research Group.

## Regional Divisions

The report from *IADR Regional Board Members* informed the council that most of the regions have been able to maintain their activities regarding member's engagement in research, promotion of membership among health researchers, undergraduates, and postgraduate students, establishing partnership with industry and government agencies, regular meetings, and collaborative national and international networking.

## President and CEO Reports

Annual meeting, Exhibition, Partnership: To ensure the health and safety of everyone participating, the 2022 IADR meeting, held in conjunction with the 5<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Asia/Pacific Region (APR), was once again carried out in a virtual format. Over 2,132 individuals from 80 countries attended the event, and a record-breaking participation by our colleagues in the APR.

The 2023 IADR/LAR meeting was 100% live and in-person format and was joined by the 12<sup>th</sup> World Congress on Preventive Dentistry (WCPD). The WCPD aims to raise global awareness of oral diseases and encourage policy makers to incorporate oral health into public health intervention programs and universal health coverage, focusing particularly on oral cancer prevention, dental caries, and periodontal disease.

The IADR and FDI World Dental Federation are partners in the project titled, "Accelerate implementation of dental amalgam provisions and strengthen country capacities in the environmental sound management of associated wastes under the Minamata Convention. The project aims to phase down the use of dental amalgam in three countries; Senegal, Thailand, and Uruguay, and improve the management of mercury-containing waste.

Publications: The *Journal of Dental Research* reached its highest ever Impact Factor™ in 2022 (8.924) and ranked #3 of 92 journals in the "Dentistry, Oral Surgery, and Medicine" category. Other achievements were the publication of the supplement "The Changing Face of Dentistry" in September of 2022 and the Special Issue entitled "Aging and Oral Health" in July of 2023.

Last November, the IADR president represented our entity during of the Global Oral Health Status Report launched by the World Health Organization, which reviewed the most recent data on major oral diseases, risk factors, health system challenges, and opportunities for reform.

Membership: As of December 31, 2022, IADR membership stood at 9,191 members, an 8.1% increase from the previous year's total of 8,505. The increase in 2022 membership was driven by extremely strong growth in the APR (+60.6%) Region. Divisions with the strongest 2022 growth were the Tunisian (+309%), Chinese (+223%), Egyptian (+78.6%), and Kuwaiti (+55.4%) Divisions.

Congratulations to **LAR/Costa Rican Section** (200% increased membership, 12 in 2022 to 36 in 2023) and **LAR/Colombian Division** (73% increased membership, 93 in 2022 to 162 in 2023) for demonstrating such remarkable membership growth.

Finances: The IADR investment portfolio as of December 21, 2021, was just under \$17.6 million, a net increase of 12.5% from 2020. This increase was the net of strong investment returns partially offset by amounts sold to fund operations. Although unaudited, the IADR portfolio balance as of Q1 2023 was \$14.9 million, the decrease is primarily due to significant market losses in 2022, partially offset by positive returns of 5.6% in the first quarter of 2023. Preliminary year-end estimates for 2022 project IADR ending the year with a \$734,000 deficit versus a budgeted deficit of \$707,000, or \$27,000 unfavorable to budget. The higher-than-expected deficit is due to an expected meeting deficit from the June 2022 virtual General Session as compared to a modest budgeted surplus and a slightly higher-than-expected general operations deficit primarily due to lower than expected membership revenues, partially offset by lower Board costs.

Council approved the **IADR Palestinian Section Application**.

Council approved the **IADR Bylaws Update- Membership Grace Period**.

Council approved the **IADR 2021 Independent Auditors' Report**.

Council approved the **IADR Budget for 2023**.

Council approved the **2027 IADR General Session Site Selection** of Melbourne, Australia.

Council approved the **IADR Oral Diseases as Noncommunicable Diseases (NCDs) and within the Global NCDs Agenda White Paper**.

The interactive session sought feedback from the Council on the format of the IADR General Session and mechanisms to improve the quality of the science at IADR meetings.

## Ryge-Mahler Award for Clinical Research

The Dental Materials Group (DMG) of the IADR makes two annual awards in recognition of the past contributions to Dental Materials science and research by four outstanding DMG scientists: Dr. Floyd Peyton, Dr. Eugene Skinner, Dr. Gunnar Ryge and Dr. David Mahler. The awards are made to recognize scientists who, throughout their careers, had made outstanding contributions to (1) innovation in dental materials (**Peyton-Skinner award**) and, (2) clinical research in dental materials (**Ryge-Mahler award**). Previous award winners are listed on the DMG home page (<http://www.iadr.org/DMG/>).

### Eligibility:

Nominations for the Peyton-Skinner award for innovation and Ryge-Mahler award for clinical research can be made by any candidate who meets the following criteria:

1. Nominee must be a current or past member of the IADR Dental Materials Group.
2. Nominations must include a Curriculum Vitae that provides supporting evidence that the candidate nominee has significantly contributed to any innovation in the laboratory dental materials (Peyton-Skinner award) and/or clinical research in dental materials (Ryge-Mahler award).
3. A letter of nomination should highlight the major reasons and body of research/innovation for which the individual is being nominated. All work considered for such an award should have resulted in publications in scientific, peer-reviewed journals and/or patents.

### Awards:

A plaque of recognition and an economic reward of \$2,000 will be provided for each award. The cash award is intended to support travel and other related fees to attending the IADR annual meeting and receiving the award in person at the DMG business meeting or reception.

### Selection:

DMG Award committee will review individuals newly nominated and those not selected during the last three successive selection periods. The award recipient will be formally announced during the business meeting of the Dental Materials Group at the IADR General Session & Exhibition and honored during the reception that follows. The committee may reserve the right to grant no award if there is no suitable candidate may take elect not to present an award if there is not an appropriate nominee.

**Note:** Past recipients of the IADR Wilmer Souder Award are not eligible, but acceptance of either of these two awards does not disqualify one for the Wilmer Souder Award.

## Stephen Bayne Mid-Career Award

The objective of this new Mid-Career Award is to recognize IADR members who have demonstrated significant contribution to the science and application of dental materials research by their mid-career with the aim to help attract and retain younger investigators in this field of dental materials research. To remain a vital and relevant organization, it is imperative for the DMG to maintain and invigorate our pipeline of researchers engaged in all aspects of traditional dental materials as well as materials-centered studies applied to the oral/facial complex. To encourage diverse, high-quality research perspectives and initiatives, we want to be fully inclusive in this outreach to include individuals from any institution as well as from all regions of the IADR - North America, Latin America, Europe, Africa/Middle East, Asia/Pacific.

### Requirements:

1. Nominee must be a current or past member of the IADR Dental Materials Group.
2. Nominee must have minimum of five years research experience beyond the granting of their PhD.
3. At least a three-year record of participation as lead author on abstracts presented at IADR or related DMG-sponsored programs.
4. Current CV along with two letters of support from established and productive DMG members as well as a brief narrative (one-page maximum) that highlights how the individual's prior research accomplishments are anticipated to transition in work going forward (specific details not necessary but a general idea of the intended research direction is requested).

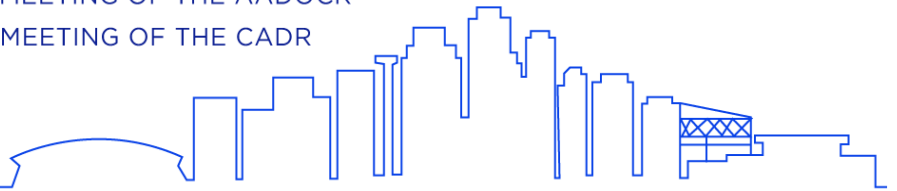
